

## **DAWSON'S CREEK**

**When:** Saturday, June 7, 2008,  
**Launch:** 10 a.m.

**Where:** From the NC Wildlife Ramp near the mouth of Dobson's Creek

**Paddle Distance:** Less than 8 miles

**Trip Difficulty:** Moderate

**Skill Requirements:** Novice-Intermediate.

**Trip Details:** Join our TRPC members from Pamlico County for this paddle. We will launch at the NCWRC ramp near the mouth of Dawson's Creek and paddle upstream toward the curious remains of Mill Dam, the site of an old grist mill and return. This interesting paddle offers many small tributaries to explore with time permitting. The creek offers some protection to the paddler in case of strong wind.

**Provisions Needed:** Approved PFD (must wear), water, lunch or snacks, sun screen or UV protective clothes and hat.

**Time on water:** 4 hours with lunch.

**Shuttle:** No shuttle is required; this is a circle paddle trip

### **Driving Directions:**

From New Bern take Hwy 55 toward Oriental. At the stop light in Grantsboro (Hwy 306) turn right heading toward the Minnesott Ferry. About 10.8 miles, turn left on Buckland Road. Follow Buckland Road past Cash Corners where it turns into Janiero Road and on past the bridge that crosses Dawson's Creek. Just past (1/2 mile) the curve where Janiero Road starts to heads north, you will see the NCWRC sign directing you to the ramp. Turn and follow the unimproved road to landing.
